MEETING:

Meeting called to order at 7:00 PM by President Werner Kuehn.

President called for comments/corrections to the minutes, hearing none, President Kuehn ordered the minutes approved and placed on file, and the Treasurer's Report placed on file.

Public Comment: None

GUEST SPEAKER: Roseville Environmental Utilities – Rate proposal

Terri Shirhall and Diana Vargas of the Roseville Environmental Utilities Division presented the proposed rate hike that will be presented to City Council for approval. The basic proposals would be as follows:

Several items were listed for factors influencing costs, including technology investment (billing system, meters); system rehabilitation, and unfunded state mandates (compliance with state directed programs). More information will be distributed by the City of Roseville.

ROUNDTABLE:

Roseville Police: No liaison present.

City of Roseville: Sean Bigley, Community Relations

- The City will host its Annual Volunteer Appreciation event this April. This year, the City would like to invite all the active NA Representatives; Sue will distribute the invitations when she receives them.
- The City of Roseville sent 8 officers to Oroville to help with the recent evacuations, and had staff helping at the Placer Fairgrounds to set up shelters.
- City Council members will continue individual informal public meetings—Mayor Rohan will meet 10AM tomorrow at Timber Lodge; full schedule will be posted at the Council section of the City's website.
- The City is reviewing legislative and regulatory items for 2017. One item of concern they expect to address to the state is the drought-stress test, which they feel should now be eased given this past winter's rainfall and snowpack totals.
- Sue Cook inquired about replenishing recycling and water saving handouts for Earth Day; Sean said he'll contact Rachel Toker to get a supply ready for the event.

Fire Department: Jaime Garrett, PIO

- Staff assisted at the shelter opened by Placer County Health during the recent Oroville crisis, and many helped Red Cross on-site in Oroville; they are on standby to reopen if needed.
- Next Fire Department Open House will be April 1st at Station #9 (Fiddyment Farm).

• Expected to break ground Station #1 (Oak Street downtown) this March, and be completed by Feb. 2018. Fire Admin has moved to 316 Vernon Street. Wermer Kueh mentioned that the current Station #1 will be purchased by Warrick University for use as a 'grad school' campus.

<u>Roseville Heights</u>: Lori Ennis said their NA will probably have to go inactive at the next meeting; Los Cerritos did not wish to join their NAs.

<u>**Cirby Ranch**</u>: Robert Velcheck: Will hold a general meeting in two weeks.

Maidu: Jim Kidd: Distributed their newsletter; noted Annual Garage Sale 4/29; Sergeant Elementary School was able to work out arrangements with the School District to keep playgrounds open for the public after school and weekends.

Stoneridge: Bonnie Wachter: They are advertising their next quarterly meeting for 3/2.

Los Cerritos: Trevor Smith: Next meeting will be next Tuesday 6PM.

Kaiser Permanente is hosting a public information meeting and open house on **March, 22, 2017**, from 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. in the Civic Center Meeting Rooms #1 and 2 of the Roseville Civic Center, 311 Vernon Street, Roseville, California, to provide interested individuals with information on the proposed construction by Kaiser Permanente at its 1001 Riverside Avenue address. Additional information on this project is available on the City's Planning Division website.

Project Information

Kaiser Permanente, a leader in advancing the total health of its members and communities, plans to build a new, state-of-the-art medical office building at the site of its current Riverside Medical Offices at 1001 Riverside Ave. If approved by the City of Roseville, the new medical office building will be approximately 210,000-square-feet and replace the current facility. Construction is expected to begin in June, 2017.
