MEETING:

Meeting called to order at 7:00 PM by President Werner Kuehn.

President called for comments/corrections to the minutes, hearing none, President Kuehn ordered the minutes approved and placed on file, and the Treasurer's Report placed on file. The RCONA Audit Report for 2016 was ordered accepted and placed on file.

Public Comment: None

GUEST SPEAKER: City Manager Rob Jensen and Assistant City Manager Dominic Casey.

Topic I - Engage Roseville!

City Manager Rob Jensen referred to the City Council meeting last night, based on the growth of the city and the fiscal needs; the city is growing at a faster rate and financially we are growing at a slower rate. It was expedient for the city to form a group that will look at the finances and growth. This outcome has resulted in the ENGAGE ROSEVILLE: a community conversation about priorities. The complete handout has been attached at the end of the minutes for your review.

How are we going to tackle the budget gap? The City is taking a proactive stance and directed the staff at the February 2nd goal workshop to initiate a process involving the community aimed at evaluating the City's general fund operations and revenues. The goal is to find a way to balance the City's obligations to maintain fiscal stability while continuing to provide high quality essential services and address long term liabilities.

City Manager Jensen stated, "The Council directed the formation of the Advisory Committee including:

Planning Commission Representative (1)

Parks and Recreations Commission Representative (1)

Transportation Commission Representative (1)

Roseville Chamber of Commerce President or designee (1)

School District Superintendents or designees (2)

Community members at Council discretion (8-13 at Council discretion) to seek a diverse range of geographic/neighborhood, generational, and demographic representation on the committee.

Applicants for at-large positions should indicate their status as, or affiliation with, one or more of the following: Roseville resident, Roseville Coalition of Neighborhood Association (RCONA), Downtown Roseville business owners, small business owners based in Roseville and major Roseville employers.

It is expected the Advisory Committee will complete its work and produce deliverables to the City Council no later than March, 2018. The Advisory Committee will meet the second and fourth Wednesday in the evenings.

Recruitment for Committee members will close on May 19, 2017. Appointments are scheduled to be announced at the City Council meeting at 7:00 PM on Monday, June 12, 2017. Dominic Casey stated, the goal is to have good representation from throughout the City of Roseville.

A Q&A period followed:

- Will there be power in the Committee? The Advisory Committee will develop a strategic plan. The City Council will have the information that will help them make the best decisions. City Manager has a lot of trust in the City Council and also have trust that the community will have the best interest in the city. City Council will have the last decision.
- How much will the City's legal counsel be involved to address issues expediently? The City legal unit will be present at all meetings.
- What will be key focus points? Sales tax and property tax are two major sources of income
 for Roseville. The community will be informed about the City's budget, fiscal situation and
 needs, including revenues, expenses and challenges (i.e. Utility money can only be used for
 utility).
- Budget: The City of Roseville did not get the expected tax revenue this year, consequently
 creating budgetary issues. This leads to the city's departments looking at what they are
 funding that can be shifted. They will also have to address "unfunded mandates" as
 directed from the state. Scott Alvord emphasized the Council wants the Committee to
 come back with information that will impact the City's decisions.
- A pin map will be utilized to make sure we have representatives geographically across the community for this Community Advisory Committee.
- Jim Kidd stated he hopes at least one or two members of RCONA get on the Committee and come back to the monthly meetings and share some of the findings so we can share feedback.

Topic II - Core Goals: Priorities Goals: Safety, Fiscal Responsibilities, Reliable Utilities.

The City Council identified their responsibility with the older neighborhoods, they would be developing strategies to assist the neighborhoods in rehabilitation. There are funds available to assist neighborhoods such as Community Development block grant funds, through housing, safety home improvements, painting programs are available. New communities pay special funds that are set aside specifically for those communities; but for older core areas, the improvements have been paid out of the City's General Funds.

However, if older communities are interested in future improvements, they can self-assess for the purpose of community development. The City will come and speak to the community and support the members on developing viable plans to develop a revenue stream.

As mentioned, there are other sources for funds available for home improvement—Community Development block grants are available to neighborhoods and can be initiated by local communities. City Manager Rob Jensen will send web site information to Werner for home improvements in older neighborhoods.

Mike Hazen from Cherry Glen neighborhood stated the problems they are facing to get people to self-assess themselves—they are the lowest income neighborhood in the city. Neighborhood clean-up was done well with Roseville Heights and Cherry Glen working together. Jim Kidd encouraged all members interested to submit their applications.

"Core" area was defined as anything that is not in a Specific Plan, mainly those older areas downtown. Rob Jensen invited NAs to talk about Core Community Planning, and to invite the City Manager and Assistant City Manager to their local neighborhood association meetings.

ROUNDTABLE: proceeded with comments noted in the attached RCONA Neighborhood News Newsletter.

ADMINISTRATIVE & COMMITTEE ITEMS:

Scholarship Committee: Werner Kuehn and Doris Jones stated the Committee met quickly due to time constraints and we will enhance our process for Scholarship Awards for 2018. We will be attending the high school graduations and invite the winners to our meeting in June, 2017. It is about community service. We have ideas on developing the selection process for next year. We are building on Sue's forms with adding local NA's volunteers. Contact school now for National Night Out.

Community First Bank: Sue Cook said Carol Garcia of Community First Bank had contacted RCONA to offer us bank accounts with no charges. Jim Kidd and Sue Cook met with Ms. Garcia at the bank to discuss advantages offered, including hard copies of bank statements (no cost). Sue advised Ms. Garcia that we have 17 accounts, the bank was willing to accept all our accounts and is willing to work with us for a smooth transition. They are reaching out to service us for our community service. Sue noted the one disadvantage is that there is only one branch, located on Douglas Blvd. Sue will send out information regarding changing banks—please share this information with your NA boards for potential vote at the May RCONA meeting. If a decision is made to move to the new bank, the bank will provide account cards that can be prepared in advance and delivered to the bank through RCONA or directly by NAs (no need to have all present at the bank at the same time).

MOVIE IN THE PARK 2017-PARKS: Jim mentioned Lighthouse Printing's work done for MITP flyers and posters, and said they are very reasonable and provide quality service. Jim suggested we could think of using this company for printing newsletters. Werner said we will have signs set up to direct people to the parks with an arrow pointing to the park in strategic areas. Sue suggested small banners to put in strategic places, but will check with Code Enforcement for this issue.
