RCONA Executive Reports

<u>Approval of June 15, 2017 Minutes</u>: June minutes were not received, will have to be submitted at August meeting for approval.

<u>Receipt of Treasurer's Report</u>: Hearing no inquiries or objections, the President ordered the Treasurer's Report, dated January 1, 2017 to July 16, 2017, placed on file as submitted. Werner noted addition of Trust accounting for 2 categories: Inactive NA Funds held in trust, and new Scholarship Funds held in trust (currently MITP movie raffles proceeds).

<u>Public Comment:</u> Werner Kuehn mentioned the proposed Sites Reservoir project and the intended letter of support he will submit on behalf of RCONA. Scott Alvord described where the project would be and indicated the City of Roseville would have a seat on the Board.

Guest Speakers:

<u>NUSA</u>—Laxmi Rao attended the NUSA Conference in Omaha in May as RCONA Representative; she gave a slide-show presentation on her overall trip (great photos) and the seven workshops she attended. She said 215 NA organizations attended the conference. The presentation will be posted on the RCONA website. Loren will try to obtain other workshop materials to add to the RCONA site, but they should be available briefly on the NUSA website as well.

Neighborhood Watch—Rob Baquera, Police Community Relations, presented the newly modified Neighborhood Watch Guide (on PD Website), and encouraged neighborhoods to consider the added 'virtual' neighborhood watch (NW) program. He indicated Roseville is listed as the 29th safest city in the country, but we still have crime. The police feel community involvement is key to crime prevention and noted the following measures employed, including: RCONA's 16 active NAs, Citizens' Academy, police volunteers, Drug Take Back Days, Police open houses and Social Services unit (focus on 'unsheltered' population). He noted the new Keep Watch Camera Registry (police may contact you if crime occurs in your area)—sign up on the PD's website).

He said Nextdoor.com allows you to form a 'micro' group, and allows you to send 10 postcards per month to invite neighbors to join the new virtual NW group. The PD is creating a map of camera locations and NW groups.

Round Table proceeded with comments noted on the attached *RCONA Neighborhood News* newsletter.

A list of regular NA meeting schedules is posted on the RCONA.org website.

City Report: No representative present.

Roseville Police: Rob Baquera gave general crime stats for past 2015/16—50,644-911 calls (up 18%); and 152,449 on-site incidents (2% increase). Although an increase in rapes and robbery overall, aggravated assaults were down 36%. Burglaries were down 24% (keep garage doors closed). Police restructuring shift assignments, Rob will send new schedules to Sue to distribute. Please notify sergeants if you have any changes to NA meeting schedules.

Roseville Fire: Jaime Garrett announced:

- Aug.5—Open House Station #3 9-11 AM
- Station #1 under construction, expect to open April 2018 (2 weeks behind due to heat—OSHA requirements prohibit work in extreme heat).
- They're hiring 10 people, some are new Fire Fighters-1 status, but a few will be Fire Fighter-2 status with some fire background; all will attend a Fire Academy first.
- One crew currently assigned to the Detwiler Fire (Mariposa) for 2-week max assignment.;
 one crew assisted at Auburn fire (juveniles started and reported the fire). Juveniles may be required to attend educational program with parents, could be charged as 'arson' offenses.
- July 4th was very busy with high number of calls, but no serious damage.

Agenda Items & Committee Updates

CPAC—Community Priorities Advisory Committee

Scott Alvord gave brief intro—first orientation meeting was held July 12th and can be found on You Tube, Council TV, and Loren has a link on the RCONA.org website. He indicated communication limits of the Brown Act, but they did indicate that you can submit questions or comments to a committee member, or City members Mike Isom or Kathy Pease. Further information is available on the City's website—Engage Roseville. He also encouraged people to sign up on www.flashvote.com—the City will send out questions for feedback from individuals. If you are already signed up on Placerflashvote.com then you are already entered for CPAC. Scott also noted he will hold a Coffee with a Council Member at Shady's Coffee at 10 AM this Saturday (July 22nd).

ByLaws Committee:

Two amendments were presented by Bylaws Committee members (approved by committee, no motion required). Both proposed amendments were previously distributed to active Neighborhood Associations both in May and June. Sue Cook announced that a 2/3 quorum was present to proceed with elections (amendments to bylaws requires a 2/3 quorum present):

- Neighborhood Watch Procedure: Jim Kidd presented the proposed amended RCONA
 Neighborhood Watch Procedure—revised to conform to the Police Department's new NW
 protocol; procedure still provides requirements for active Neighborhood Watch groups to
 obtain NW signs with RCONA contribution for half the cost of the NW signs.
 Werner called for a vote to approve amendment of RCONA's Neighborhood Watch
 Procedure as proposed; vote was unanimous in favor.
- 2. Amendment of RCONA Bylaws: Robert Sanchez presented a brief overview of the proposed amendments to two sections of the RCONA Bylaws:
 - a) ART. VIII.Sect.2 & 3—changed wording to allow any member to participate on an RCONA Committee (doesn't have to be from an 'active' NA), but chairpersons must be a board member of an active NA.
 - b) ART. Vii.Sec.6—Allows NA Board members to act as alternates for RCONA votes (can't just be any neighborhood members, must be a board member to act as alternate). After brief discussions, Werner called for a vote to approve proposed RCONA Bylaws amendments as proposed; vote was unanimous in favor.

Administration & Executive Board Comments:

<u>RCONA Technology</u>: Loren Cook stated a new feature is available for the NA websites—would redirect NA websites through the RCONA website; he's looking for 3 NAs to volunteer to test this out. Contact Loren Cook.

In addition to the usual NW meeting formats, he encouraged neighborhoods to establish "virtual" NW groups. Nextdoor.com allows you to form 'micro' groups within your NA groups. It will also allow you to send 10 postcards per month to recruit neighbors for the group. He also discussed the new Watch Camera Registry—if you have a surveillance camera system in place, sign up on the Policy registry and they may call on you if a crime is reported in your area

Fire: Jaime Garrett, PIO, said the next Open House will be Sat. Aug. 5th at Station #3 9-11 AM; Station #1 is under construction and expects to open April 2018; 10 new Staff to fill current vacancies will be hired—both Fire Fighters levels 1 and 2, still must complete the academy. One crew at Detwiler Fire (Mariposa), and another crew is at Auburn (started by juveniles)

Engage Roseville:
