Called to Order: 6:37 By Steve Parker, Vice Chair.

Minutes: The minutes of the April 21, 2022, meeting were accepted as amended and placed on file.

Public Comment: none

Roseville Police Update, Officer Scott Miszkewycz: Flock cameras have made 101 hits of which 98 stolen vehicles from outside of Roseville have been recovered. They also help with identifying theft patterns. A team of catalytic converter thieves were caught. A new scam being used now is false QR codes in restaurants for bill payment or in parking lots for payment. Be sure the code goes to the rightful recipient; no Roseville parking has QR code payment. Keep garage doors closed to avoid theft. When concerned with speeding in your area, contact the traffic division with place and time of day and they'll try to address.

Roseville Fire Department Update, Jaime Garrett : California is expecting the worst fire season to date. Today is a red flag warning day and all are asked to be cautious. The fire department will help with smoke alarm installations when needed. Members extended thanks for the goat weed abatement program.

Guest Speaker-Placer County Urban Ag Program, Brian Pimentel of the Placer Resource Conservation District: Placer County has an urban ag program that will bring their expertise in habitat, soil and conservation to your events or NA meetings. It is designed to be useful with backyard and community gardens, is free, and provides technical assistance and advise on pests, growing conditions, and more. They also work with forestry and landowners to improve forest health and assist with prescribed burns. Regarding agriculture, they are experts in composting, irrigation soil health and habitat. The backyard garden assistance program ends June 30th, so ask for a home visit soon. They also provide a program addressing food insecurity, distributing portable tomato plants. They are developing plans for how to build a raised bed garden. They also work to remove invasive plant species from our waterways. To learn more contact Andrew Justus-Fritz at Andrew@placerrcd.org.

Roseville City Update, Brian Jacobson: no report

Spring Clean-Up Committee Report, Jim Kidd: 300 cars attended the first event at Maidu with approx. 200 at Woodcreek Oaks at the second event. This Saturday will be hosted by Fiddymment Farms and West Park NAs at St. John's Church. Organizers are encouraged to advertise in their local channels and be prepared to provide morning snacks and lunch/drinks for your team plus 8-10 city workers.

Logo Committee Formation, Melinda Surmani: In the past, the city provided some updated options for the RCONA Logo, designed by the city graphic artist, and asked for RCONA's opinion on our preferences. We need a committee to review the options and attend a meeting with Brian Jacobsen who will invite the graphic artist to reach a consensus. Andrew Waldrop and Christie Borchin volunteered. Placer County Elections Poll Work Fundraising, Ellen Debach-Riley : NA's have another way to raise money for their neighborhoods; create a service team to work a precinct at the Polls for the June and November elections. For one day's work, you could earn up to \$800. It requires a minimum of 5 people; one Inspector (lead), one Judge (back up lead) and three clerks. The day is long (6am-9pm) but clerk positions can be broken into shifts. Our NA has 4 four-hour shifts, allowing for shorter hours and more volunteers. NA Organization Committee Proposal for June 16, Jim Kidd: The committee's job is to help activate Neighborhood Associations. In cooperation with Roseville PD, the committee would like to provide an event inviting all Roseville residents to learn about RCONA, our Neighborhood Associations and our relationship with RPD. The event would be held from 5:30pm to 6:30pm at the Martha Riley Meeting Rooms, followed by pizza and beverages and then by the regular RCONA meeting at 7:00pm. RPD will begin sending out fliers for the event on June 1st calling for rsvp's. The final decision will be made at the June 9th EBoard meeting. On May 25th, the Cirbyside Neighborhood Association is scheduled to become active, and the Foothills Junction Neighborhood is scheduled to be activated on September 21.

Neighborhood Round Table:

Cherry Glen: The annual yard sale was one week ago. They are working on plans for National Night Out and the upcoming Spring Clean up events.

Cirby Ranch: There is a large construction site in the area that could be encroaching on the residential areas. Bob Velcheck will explore resident's interest in this issue and hope it may bring more participants to the NA.

Fiddymment Farm: Bob Gorman reported their joint meeting with West Park NA was hosted by Loren Cook on May 10th. The next meeting will be June 14th, in-person at St. John's Church featuring a presentation on a 186-townhome development. There NNO will also be coordinated with West Park NA and will have food trucks, RPD and Fire representatives.

Folsom Road: No report. Requested contact info for Ben to help with their website development.

Foothills Junction: Andrew reported looking forward to activating with at least two adjacent neighborhoods interested in attending.

Historic Sierra Vista: At our April meeting we had Jason Shykowski, Director of Public Works speak on how to pursue improving our sidewalks. Once they have evidence of resident approval of a specific proposed request, they will seek funding. We have organized a service group to work the polls on June 7th and are planning our annual Garage Sale on June 4th followed by the Spring Clean-Up event on June 18th.

Kaseberg-Kingswood: Their Garage Sale event will be held this weekend following the distribution of 1300 fliers/newsletters by two people! Twenty-five people have signed up to participate with a map to be printed and distributed at the event.

Los Cerritos: In coordination with the Roseville Heights NA, their last meeting was well attended, addressing Weber Park improvement needs with City Council and police. Council has now announced they will provide 3 million dollars towards renovations to the park. This has been 5 years in discussion with a final positive outcome.

Maidu: On June 18th there will be a Pancake Breakfast event with Police Chief Bergstrom helping to cook ahead of Father's Day.

Pleasant Grove: April 30th was their Spring Clean-Up event, no other current activities planned. The next meeting will be next week.

Roseville Heights: See Los Cerritos report

Stoneridge: The general meeting will be May 23 at 7pm at Cambria Park. Postings will be in the newsletter via mailchimp.

West Park: Their meeting was last Tuesday, as reported by Bob of Fiddymment Farms. The new Raley's store is on track to open in June. New development continues in the area with a Marketplace to be created on Baseline and Fiddymment Roads. Their Spring Clean-Up will be this weekend.

Final Comments: Fireworks Committee: Need to decide if we will accept the offer of 25% proceeds from sales with an offered partnership. Loren indicated Phantom Fireworks may also be seeking a volunteer organization to staff a booth. Needs more investigation.
