Public Comment:

Roseville Police Update, Officer Ciampa:

- Bike Fest will be on June 3rd in Downtown Roseville
- A few calls have come in regarding Scams. The main police line has been duplicated and there are calls going to residents that show the police department number on caller ID.
 - The police dept will never call you, they will come to your door if they need to get ahold of you.
 - o If someone calls ask for ID and don't give them any information.
 - Please let your NA's know.
- Tacos with Cops event happened in May- large turn out from police and fire departments. The weather was horrible, but the event went well.
 - Hillcrest residents did not come, but members of the church next door showed interested in participating in RCONA as part of the Hilcrest NA.

Roseville City Update, Brian Jacobson:

- BOSCH announced they are buying TSI Simi Conductor location for \$1.5 billion. They will manufacture chips to go into electric cars, and provide jobs to residents.
- Annual point in time count for Homelessness in Placer County showed a 5% decrease in homeless people in the county. In City of Roseville the count also showed a decrease with 323 people counted in 2022, and 240 counted in 2023. More information can be found on city of Roseville Website.
